# What's on the ballot in 2026?

Arkansas voters have a say this November whether they want to change the Arkansas Constitution. State legislators voted to put three proposed constitutional amendments and a bond issue on the ballot for you to decide. Citizen groups are also collecting voter signatures to qualify proposals for the ballot.

### LEGISLATIVE PROPOSALS

The Secretary of State's Office will assign numbers to each of the following measures this summer:

- **HJR1018** – The Citizen's Only Voting Amendment
- **SJR11** – A constitutional amendment to amend Arkansas Constitution, Article 2, § 5, to protect the right to keep and bear arms.
- **SJR15** - A constitutional amendment concerning economic development in the state of Arkansas; and authorizing the General Assembly to provide for the creation of economic development districts to promote economic development.
- **Bond Issue** - Issuance of State of Arkansas water, waste disposal and pollution abatement facilities general obligation bonds, not to exceed \$500 million.
