



Project Name: Mayflower Library

Description of Project: The Mayflower Library has multi-plant beds in front of the library including a butterfly garden divided by a gravel path. Beds on each side of the entrance include large hollies, various shrubs, annuals and perennials. On the far right of the library entrance is a river birch surrounded by phlox and planted with annuals in summer. At the side of the building is the Jo Magee Memorial Garden in memory of Master Gardener Jo Magee and the Mayflower residents affected by the 2014 tornado. It includes three crepe myrtles, hydrangeas, salvia and hostas. This garden is a work in progress. Planters on each side of the entrance contain summer annuals and perennial grasses and are replanted with violas for fall and winter.
