Project Name: Vilonia Library

Description of Project: Planted beds surrounding the library building that include a pollinator's garden planted with native plants and small trees. The grounds also include a small bed surrounding our FCMG Pollinator's Garden signage, a bed surrounding our flag pole, and a memorial bench and plaque honoring victims of the 2011 and 2014 tornados that swept the area. Eighteen native trees have been planted on the grounds since 2011 to establish a teaching arboretum for the Vilonia patrons.
