Insect Pests Infesting 2024 Blackberry Crop

Demethylation Inhibiting (DMI) Fungicide Safety Screening on Creeping Bentgrass Putting Greens

Fungicides are generally safe on turfgrasses. However, certain fungicides, particularly ones belonging to the demethylation inhibitor (DMI) group, can cause phytotoxicity to turfgrasses. A screening was conducted on the nine market-available DMI fungicides to determine which were the safest.

Altosid IGR XRB was recently registered to control horn flies on cattle. It is an extended release bolus containing the insect growth regulator (S)-Methoprene and prevents adult horn flies from emerging from the manure of treated cattle.
