What is Mediation?

Mediation is a method for resolving problems or disagreements without resorting to court. Mediation is meant to help farmers, lenders, and others impacted by the dispute work through disagreements in a faster and less expensive way than a lawsuit. Mediation enables people to discuss their issues and find a mutually agreeable solution.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) pays for mediation programs in many states. These programs use trained mediators to help navigate issues related to farm loans, USDA decisions, conservation programs, wetland rules, rural water loans, grazing land, pesticides, rural housing, business loans, and crop insurance.

The Coalition of Agriculture Mediation Programs (CAMP) is a group that connects certified mediation programs across the country, especially in the Southeast. However, Kentucky, South Carolina, and Tennessee are not part of CAMP. If you're in one of those states, contact your local Farm Service Agency (FSA) office for help.

How Does Mediation Work?

In most places, mediation is something you can choose to do, and it often happens before a formal complaint or appeal is filed. To get started, contact your state's certified mediation program. A representative will then contact you to explain how it works and to learn more about the situation.

If everyone agrees to try mediation, a meeting is typically scheduled within a few weeks. In Arkansas, lenders are required to offer mediation to farmers, but farmers have the option to decide to participate.

Why Try Mediation?

Mediation has several potential benefits:

• A neutral person helps everyone understand each other.

- People can create their own fair solutions.
- It can improve relationships.
- It saves time and money compared to going to court.
- It encourages honest and respectful conversation.
- It is private and voluntary, so you don't have to go if you don't want to, and what you say stays confidential.

How Much Does Mediation Cost?

Many mediation programs are free. Some might charge a small fee. If interested, please contact your state mediation program about the cost.
